In Conversation: Natalie Baszile & Carlton Turner

Natalie Baszile is the author of We Are Each Other's Harvest and Queen Sugar. In this conversation, she will discuss the importance of Black landownership and agriculture and how to embrace abundance even when up against a multi-generational legacy of discrimination and systemic lack of access to resources. Interviewing Natalie is Carlton Turner, who is Founder, Co-Director, and Lead Artist of Sipp Culture, the Mississippi Center for Culture Production; Carlton also works across the country as a performing artist, arts advocate, policy shaper, lecturer, consultant, and facilitator.

How Everywhere Can Be Home For All with Ray Suarez

Ray Suarez will join RA Fellows, Phillip Norman and Smmo Ozawa in conversation about how immigration is reshaping rural communities across the country and how intergenerational interdependence is critical to the success of the United States as a whole. Suarez is host of the new PBS television series, <u>Wisdom Keepers</u>, on air and online on PBS content services. He is the author of the recent book on the modern era of American immigration, We Are Home: Becoming American in the 21st Century. Norman and Ozawa have spent their fellowship with Rural Assembly working on an upcoming podcast about immigration in rural communities.

Essentials for Positive Sum Thinking: Trust, Relationships & Collaboration

Hear from a group of leaders based in rural Southwest Washington State and learn how respect, friendship, and constant collaboration can build abundance and community. Salaam Green, poetry reading from The Other Revival

Birmingham, Alabama Poet Laureate Salaam Green will read from her recently released poetry collection, The Other Revival, which reclaims the Southern revival as a space for truth-telling and healing through oral tradition. Green uses poetry to create healing spaces grounded in Southern history and resilience. At a time when history is being erased, this book reminds us that the most vital archives live in people—in their voices, memories, and willingness to pass stories on.

Larry & Joe

Larry Bellorin and Joe Troop, of the latingrass duo "Larry and Joe" are versatile multi-instrumentalists and singer-songwriters on a mission to show that music has no borders. Larry hails from Monagas, Venezuela and is a legend of Llanera music. Joe is from North Carolina and is a GRAMMY-nominated bluegrass and old time musician. They met in 2021 as Larry was seeking asylum in North Carolina and Joe worked to help asylum seekers.




